Time Journal (the 2nd “T” in Stewardship) from the HUG2 Fulfillment Committee

In the T3 formula for Stewardship = Treasure, Time, and Talents, the Time component may be the area we least understand and focus on. I know that is the case in my life. Far too often I see that it is bedtime and there are still things to check off my “To Do” list.

And worse, there are Christian duties that didn’t even make it onto my list. They got crowded out in the hectic bustle of my daily life. The ones that are on my list are usually related to planning an event, or an article to write, or a lesson to prepare. In other words, those things that will be actively missed by others in the Church. But what of the duties that only the Lord and I know about? Those without immediate feedback such as active discipleship and contemplation through prayer?

We are accustomed to the definition of financial tithing as ten percent of our income. Does that measure also apply to the time on earth entrusted to us? For me, the answer was found in Matthew 6:31-33: *“So do not worry, saying, ‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’ For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.”* Putting God at the center of your life, not the periphery, is His command. Seek His will for your life; ask Him what you should be doing with each precious moment and each day. For some, tithing our time in service to the Lord would be an improvement while others already far exceed that goal.

Think of your life as a book. Each day a page is written. The deeds of the day are sentences forming the paragraphs. Your attitudes are the punctuation marks. Each year begins a new chapter. When death comes, the final chapter is finished. How will your book read when it is all put together? Will it be a story of faith, courage, hope, or will it be a cheap paperback on the "not recommended" list? Review what you have written to date. It is your book! If we could write another book of our life, we would spend a lot more time editing. A good first step is to keep a Time Journal to find additional opportunities to value the precious gift of time and not to waste it. Finally, I leave you with this admonition from the Apostle James, who writes in chapter 4, verses 13-15: *Now listen, you who say, “Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money.” Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, “If it is the Lord’s will, we will live and do this or that.”*


Pastor Black- July Weekend Vacation

Camp Dermadillo

VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED for one of TLC Health Cabinet's ministries....and it promises to be a fun and easy way to help make a difference in the life of a child.



WHAT: **Camp Dermadillo** is a one-week camp for children and teens aged 9-15 held at Camp For All in Burton, TX (www.campforall.org) and sponsored by the American Academy of Dermatology (www.campdiscovery.org) and Texas Children's Hospital. Since campers come from around the country, we need your help at the airport on the day the children arrive and the day they return home.

WHEN: The campers arrive on **Sunday, August 5th**, and return home on **Friday, August 10th**. Plan on dedicating approximately 2-3 hours anywhere between 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. on the day you volunteer with more specific times assigned once we get closer to the date.

WHERE: Bush Intercontinental Airport

HOW: You will be assigned to help with one camper. On Sunday, you will meet your camper at their arrival gate. Once you collect their luggage, you will bring them to a dedicated conference room where they will be entertained by camp staff until they head off to a fun week at camp. On Friday, you will meet your camper at the conference room and then take them to get checked in and wait with them at their gate until their plane takes off.

WHY: This is a fun and easy way to help make a difference in the life of a child! Your airport parking will be free and some treats will also be provided!

We will need the name on your driver's license and your date of birth to provide to airport security so appropriate name tags and gate passes can be issued. We will hold an informational meeting on Tuesday, July 24th, during the Health Cabinet meeting, **6:30 p.m., Room 205**, for you to meet the Camp volunteer coordinators and to review the process of obtaining gate passes and other details. This information will also be provided on the day you volunteer if you cannot attend the informational session.

No, you don't have to start driving 55 mph again. However, if you were driving when it was the national speed limit, you are probably within our targeted demographic.



4th and 5th Grade Sunday School Class Eager to Learn

There is a unique group of students who gather together each Sunday morning to join in fellowship, explore the Bible, and continue their journey as young Christians. It is the 4th and 5th grade Sunday School class. These two grade levels combine into one great group of kids.

The number of students each week varies – sometimes there are just a few and sometimes the room is packed – but each week the students amaze us with their eagerness to learn, their challenging questions and their insightful answers.

Our class usually starts with a simple craft project that the students work on as they arrive. This gives them an opportunity to visit with each other and discuss their week. Our students live in many different parts of town and attend many different schools so the fellowship time, which started as a way for the kids to get to know each other, has become important to the maintenance of the friendships we have seen blossom over the year. The students have made ornaments and Advent banners to prepare for Christmas, colored crosses and painted sun catchers to celebrate Easter, and made an assortment of magnets and door hangers to always remind them of God's love. The favorite craft activity right now is working on "sand art." It is a little messy but it is also lots of fun.

Although we share fun activities, the real heart and soul of our time together is being in God's Word. Each class, the students use the Bible and either volunteer to read a portion of the lesson or follow along. This has helped each of them to be more familiar with the Bible and more comfortable in using it. It has been amazing to see how each child has developed and improved their Bible skills over the course of the year.


The lesson material and Bible stories being covered each week in class always generate lively discussions and sometimes those challenging questions. Those questions give us the opportunity to experience and utilize the

"teachable moments" that Pastor Black always reminds the Sunday School teachers to take advantage of and so we go where the kids lead us that day and discuss the things they are thinking about. Those teachable moments and challenging questions also give us another opportunity to delve into the Bible as a group to find the answers.

We also have the opportunity in our class to talk about how the lessons we are discussing apply to their lives and to the world today. We discuss a variety of topics including worship, prayer, the Reformation, the church year, church festivals, church traditions, missions, and the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion. The Sacrament of Holy Communion takes center stage when the 5th grade students leave our class during Lent to participate in the First Communion classes to prepare to take their first Communion on Maundy Thursday. They are missed while attending the First Communion Classes and upon their return are peppered with interesting questions from the younger students – What does the bread taste like? What is the wine like? The answers to these questions from a peer are highly sought after. The excitement shared by the 5th grade students about the experience was contagious and the 4th graders are eagerly anticipating their opportunity to participate in the Sacrament.

There are days when we don't quite manage to cover all the material or the lesson activities don't quite work the way they were planned but EVERY Sunday we talk about how Jesus' death and resurrection saves us all and that God loves us so much that He gave His one and only Son that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16).

We are so very proud of these young ambassadors for Christ. If you have a 4th or 5th grade student in your life, we'd love to have them join us.

Reusable Grocery Bags and Your Health

If you carry your groceries in reusable bags, here are some tips from a study from the University of Arizona and Loma Linda University that may help avoid possible problems if you use these bags. It has been found that these reusable cloth-like grocery bags sometimes harbor food-borne bacteria, among them coliform bacteria, which comes from raw meat. The study also discovered that E. Coli was found in about 12% of the bags. The suggestions below are a good review of measures you can take to be safe while being green:



- “If you use the cloth bags for raw meat, the bags should be washed regularly. At the very least, the bags should be sprayed with a bleach solution after they’ve been emptied to reduce or eliminate bacteria.
- Place raw foods in plastic bags that are available in the produce or meat section of the store before you place them in reusable bags.
- If you use them for other purposes (i.e., to carry books, gym clothes or other items) wash them before using them again for groceries.
- After emptying your bags at home, wash off the table or counter surface where the bags were sitting.
- Before folding bags and storing them, be sure to let them dry.
