This Week's Lesson:

God Is With Me

Take Home Point:

God is with me always.

DRIVE TIME HOME

PARENTS, ASK ME WHAT I DID TODAY IN KINGDOM QUEST.

- *Puppet:* Bubba learns that God is with him all the time.
- *Bible:* We read a big book about Noah.
- *Craft:* We made a craft showing that God is always with us.
- *Snack:* We ate special heart shapes with strawberry jam.
- *Game:* We played a game called *God Is With Me* to remind us that God is with us no matter what we do.
- *Singing:* To the tune of *Farmer in the Dell*: "For God is with me now, For God is with me now, He loves me all the time, For God is with me now."

FAMILY DEVOTIONS: Read the Bible Event or Bible Verse

Read from a children's picture Bible or paraphrase from an adult Bible so your child will understand. Genesis 6

LEARN BY DOING: Remind your child that God is with you as you do various activities, both at home and away from home. Include times when child misbehaves. Always remind the child that God is with us no matter what we are doing.

TALK ABOUT IT:

- God told Noah to build a boat so he would be safe during the flood.
- God was with Noah and his family until the flood was over.
- God is with me every day.

ECHO PRAYER: Child repeats each line after adult

Dear God...

We love you

You keep me safe

You are with me

Thank you, thank you, thank you

Amen.

Three Men and the Fiery Furnace

Take Home Point:

God is powerful—Trust God's power...Cool!

DRIVE TIME HOME: PARENTS, ASK ME WHAT I DID TODAY



- Puppet: Bubba learns that his hot furnace is like the Bible Event.
- Bible Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were thrown in a fiery furnace for not praying to a false god.
- Craft: We made a cool fan.
- Snack: We ate pretend firesticks.
- Game: We played Cool or Hot?
- We taught Albie the take home point.



- Participated in an interactive drama about the three Men and the Fiery Furnace
- Made cards in the Craft Zone that remind us to "Trust God's Power"
- Built a furnace out of blocks in the Play Zone.

FAMILY DEVOTIONS: Read the Bible Event from a children's' Bible:

Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego thrown in the fiery furnace (Daniel 3)

TALK ABOUT IT:

- How did God show the men in the fiery furnace he was powerful?
- What problems do you have?
- Who can help you with your problems? Why?

PRAYER POWER:

(Have child repeat after adult)

Dear God,
We love you.
You are powerful.
We trust your power.
Thank you, thank you, thank you.
In Jesus' name. Amen.

SONG OF THE DAY:

(To the tune of Row, Row, Row Your Boat)

Capitalized letters indicate emphasis on that syllable when the rhyme is sung.

FAMILY TIME OPTIONS:

Make a promise to do a fun family activity each week. Ideas include a family game night, going out for pizza, inviting friends over for dinner, or visiting a local attraction. Your child must trust you to keep your promise. Remind your child that just as he knows to trust you, we know we can trust God's power.

God Talk At Home

This Week's Kingdom Quest Lesson:

King Solomon Builds the Temple

Take Home Point:

God fills us and we worship him.

Drive Time Home

Tickler Question: What did you build in Kingdom Quest today? (*A house of cards with discussion questions on them.*) What did King Solomon build in the Bible event? (*God's house or temple.*)

God Time at Home

Select questions and adapt for your family.

FOR STARTERS: When Solomon finished building the temple, he prayed and dedicated it to the Lord. Then God's glory, probably seen as fire and smoke, filled the temple. It was so wonderful the priests couldn't enter it. Ask family members: When was a time you felt close to God and he seemed so wonderful?

READ THE BIBLE: In 1 Kings 6-8, Solomon builds the temple and dedicates it. God's glory fills the temple with smoke as a sign of his presence.

KEY VERSE: Psalm 26:8 *"Oh Lord, I love the house (temple) where you live, the place where your glory dwells."*

TALK ABOUT IT: How long did it take to build the temple? (*1 Kings 6:37. Seven years.*) There were two big rooms in the temple. What were they called? (*1 Kings 6:16. The Most Holy Place and the Holy Place.*) When the priests dedicated the temple, what happened? (*1 Kings 8:10. The glory of the Lord filled the temple with smoke.*)

Solomon's temple is no longer standing as a place where God's glory dwells. What temple does God live in today? (*1 Corinthians 6:19-20. Us, believers in Christ.*) What is the price for which our bodies were bought? (*The price was God's own Son, Jesus, who gave his life for us.*)

Jesus said about his body, "This is a temple and if you tear it down (meaning 'if I am killed'), after three days it will be raised up." Jesus knew his body would die, but after three days he would be raised up. He would rise from the dead so we could be forgiven and have Jesus live in our lives. Because of that, Jesus looks at us and says that we are a perfect place for his glory to dwell.

PRAYER POWER: Thank God that because of Jesus we are made a place worthy of God's dwelling. Ask the Lord to keep your bodies and lives a holy temple of God.

Family Time Option

One day this week, try...
