Christian Seder Meal - April 6

"Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change." James 1:17

The greatest gift given to us is the eternal life we have through Jesus by His death and resurrection. Before He sacrificed Himself for us, Jesus gave us a holy meal through which we receive His grace and forgiveness. Just as the Father graciously spared the Hebrews from death during the Passover, He not only spares us Christians but reconciles us to Him through the blood of the Holy Lamb – Jesus.

On Maundy Thursday, April 6 at 6:30 p.m., Trinity Downtown will celebrate a traditional Christian Seder meal with Holy Communion. This very special evening will also be the first time the First Communion Class participates in the Lord's Supper with our Trinity family.

Tickets are now available in the Gathering Space. Please get your ticket early as seating is limited. Tickets to the Seder are free, but receiving your tickets will secure your seats for the evening.

A freewill offering will be gathered at the Seder for the dinner prepared by Treebeards. The menu includes Chicken Fried Chicken with Cream Gravy (a limited amount of Boneless Breast of Chicken with Fresh Basil Vinaigrette will also be available), Mashed Potatoes, Fresh Green Beans with Vinaigrette, French Bread and Butter and Butter Cake.

Childcare will be available for children 6 weeks - age 3. Please RSVP for childcare when you pick up your tickets. The children will be served chicken nuggets or you may bring their dinner.

Please join our Trinity Downtown community as we gather around His Table and give thanks for the good gift that Jesus has given us in His Body and Blood.

Leaving the Lies

Lies have always been among Satan's best and most effective tools. Don't be surprised. Lies have always been Satan's stock in trade. Satan lied to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden and people have bought into his lies ever since. That's



why Jesus calls him, 'the father of lies' (John 8:44). After Jesus resisted the devil's lies during His temptation, Satan left Him for a time. Our next Blood Donor Sunday will be held March 12, 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in Room 125. If you would prefer a special time, please sign up online at https://www.commitforlife.org/donor/schedules/driveschedule/365020. While scheduling an appointment ahead of time gives us an estimate of how many donors to expect and the Blood Center sends out the appropriate number of workers; an added bonus is we take scheduled appointments prior to walk-ups.

All successful donors will receive a free general admission ticket to Big Rivers Waterpark & Adventures, an eGift Card of their choice through Tango, and a voucher for a FREE short stack of pancakes!

We look forward to a very successful drive. Double red cell and combination whole blood and plasma machines will be available for those wishing to donate that way. Both count for two donations.

Save time with the DIGITAL DONOR APP. The App makes it easy to find a blood drive, schedule your donation and answer the CFL Express Pass health history interview before you arrive.

REMINDER!! The minimum donor age requirement to give blood is 16 years old with a parent's permission. Weight must be 122 lbs. (still 110 lbs. for 17 and older) and in general good health.

REMEMBER: one unit of blood can save as many as three lives as it is broken down into three components – red blood cells, platelets and plasma.

Finance Corner - February 2023

I will praise the name of God with a song; I will **magnify** Him with thanksgiving. Psalm 69:30 ESV

The renovation of our Sanctuary began last month so that Trinity Downtown can continue to **magnify** the Lord for another 140+ years! So far, the old flooring has been removed, our vintage pews were taken to their new home(s), and new lights are being installed that will make our livestream much brighter. The Gym has become our worship center for the remainder of March.

All this activity was the direct result of the generosity of our congregation; through January 31, 2023 our Magnify Capital Campaign recorded over \$720k in pledges, coming very close to our \$750k campaign goal, and received over \$356k in gifts.

If you haven't yet had an opportunity to make a pledge to the Magnify capital campaign, please prayerfully consider doing so. You may find a commitment card as you enter the Gym, or you may record your Magnify pledge online here.

Tithes and offerings for the month of January were 3% lower than our monthly budget, and our expenses were also a bit lower than budgeted. Average worship attendance in January was 411, which is 67 more than January 2022.

Sanctuary Renovation Update

The renovation of the Foyer restrooms was substantially completed on February 3rd, and the Sanctuary was closed for construction following the worship services on February 4th. A "refresh" of the restrooms near the Gym entrance was also completed in mid-February.

The first task was to relocate the Sanctuary's audio and video equipment to the Gym, along with some liturgical worship elements, and install protection for the Sanctuary's organ and stained glass.



The next item of business was to remove the pews and existing flooring. The silent auction for the vintage shorter pews raised over \$2,000 toward the Magnify campaign, and nine of the 18' vintage pews went into the homes of congregants. The remainder of our pews are destined for a new home in a new Episcopal church in northwest Houston (San Romero Episcopal Church). Praise God that the pews will continue to serve a worshiping congregation!

Construction continues to be on schedule, with next steps including installing the new lights in the Chancel and the balcony, the new flooring, and, of course, the new pews. (See timeline on following page.)



Dependent Prayer: The Fuel for Outreach and Missions

While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off. Acts 13:2-3

The rebirth of the Church is fueled by the Holy Spirit through dependent prayer and fasting. In the early days of the Church in the book of Acts, the Church was determined to set out into new frontiers of missionary work with dependent prayer. Dependent prayer is believing that when we put our hands to the plow of missions, the seed of outreach is grown out of a people dedicated to dependent prayer, because without God's intervention the task is impossible for man. In dependent prayer, the Holy Spirit speaks and gives direction for the people of God to set out into new ministry opportunities.

Unfortunately, many churches in America set out into new things without dependent prayer. The result is the pursuit of man-centered religious activities that rarely needs the intervention of God to accomplish them. A symptom of a lack of dependent prayer is ministries that set goals and plan activities that they are confident can be fulfilled through their own talent, human enterprise, and effort. A mission mandate given by the Holy Spirit in the pursuit of God through dependent prayer as it was for



Paul and Barnabas in Antioch is always dependent on God to accomplish it. We believe with God all things are possible.

The redemptive work (Divine Invitation) in a fallen world needs a church community hyper-focused on the activity and work of God fueled by a community of believers who are convinced that their calling to join God in His redemptive work (Divine Invitation) is fully dependent on God and fueled by the desperate cry of His people in dependent prayer. God's redemptive work (Divine Invitation) can only be identified, clarified, and acted upon by the Holy Spirit who speaks to His church in the context of dependent prayer.

Dependent prayer begins in the weakest depths of our personal and corporate prayer rooms. It has been said, "Satan trembles when he sees the weakest of saints on his knees." In our weakest heartfelt prayers God listens and directs us to His redemptive work (Divine Invitation) that can only be accomplished by His presence in and among us His Beloved.

Please consider joining our staff in dependent prayer during the Lenten Season. We pray together, "God help us see what You see and accomplish only that which You can accomplish within us your Beloved." Amen.

Renewing Our Minds

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, <u>that by testing</u> you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect. Romans 12:2 ESV

St. Paul tells us in this scripture that finding the will of God for our lives apparently requires "testing." Perhaps we could interpret this text as telling us to expect "some trial and error will be involved" in finding God's will. Or perhaps Paul is telling us that "being tested" will be inherent in the process of discerning God's direction for our lives.

In truth, it's probably a bit of both.


In either case, cultivating a healthy mind and body will be an important foundation as we journey through this discernment process. Having a "renewed mind" is essential to our relationship with God, our overall health, and the quality of our life. So, what can each of us do to play our part in keeping our minds and bodies ready to hear God's whispers? Here are a few habits we can build:

- Get regular exercise. Small amounts of exercise add up, so don't be discouraged if you can't spend 30 minutes a day jogging or lifting weights!
- Eat a balanced diet.
- Make sleep a priority. This may be the most difficult habit to cultivate, but it may also be the
 most important. God designed us to sleep, and we shouldn't short-change the process.
- Practice gratitude in prayer and in your relationships.
- Stay connected to God and other people. Isolation may be the most damaging bad habit we can fall into.

Of course, our Creator knows that we need all these good things. God knows we desperately need to develop a deep relationship with Him, and with our fellow pilgrims. **Trinity Downtown's worship services**, **Discipleship Hour classes and service opportunities all offer superb opportunities to worship God, express gratitude**, and build soul-affirming and inter-generational relationships.

Are you feeling sad or anxious, facing financial difficulties or grieving the loss of a loved one? God never intended for us to go through these challenges alone. You can reach out to Trinity's Stephen Ministry for assistance. Stephen Ministers are laypeople in our congregation trained to provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care to individuals facing difficult times in life—grief, cancer, divorce, financial difficulties, hospitalization, chronic illness, job loss, disability, loneliness, a spiritual crisis, or other life struggles. They have a compassionate heart for those who are hurting, and they have been equipped with caring ministry skills by their congregation's Stephen Leaders. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with that person once a week to listen, care, pray, encourage, and offer emotional and spiritual support.

REV. JOSE R. ARGUETA



October 16 - DEPART USA

Today we meet at our international departure airport where our host will assist with check-in formalities. This evening we will enjoy a delicious dinner high above the Atlantic.

October 17 - ARRIVE TEL AVIV - JOPPA

We arrive in Tel Aviv this morning. Upon arrival, our TEMPLETON TOURS representative will meet us and assist us in gathering our luggage. After airport procedures are completed, we will meet our local guide and driver and begin our tour of the Holy Land. We

start with a visit to Joppa, Jonah's port of embarkation for Tarshish. Joppa was also the home of Tabitha (or Dorcas) who was raised from the dead by Peter. It was also here that Peter learned that God was interested in the salvation of the Gentiles. We then transfer to our hotel on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea for dinner and overnight. (D)

October 18 - TEL AVIV - CAESAREA - MOUNT CARMEL - MEGIDDO - NAZARETH -TIBERIAS

After breakfast at our hotel we will travel up the coast to Caesarea by the Sea. There we will visit the Crusaders' castle, the Roman theater, the seaport from which the Apostle Paul sailed to Rome, and the Roman aqueduct system. We will continue along the coast to Mount Carmel to see the site of Elijah's triumph over the prophets of Baal. After lunch we continue north to Megiddo on the Plain of Armageddon to see King

Solomon's stables and water supply system. Prophecy will come alive at Megiddo as we look over the Valley of Armageddon. We then travel to Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus, to visit. We will also visit The Precipice, where they wanted to throw Jesus off the "brow" and kill Him. On our way to Tiberias we will stop in the little town of Cana where Christ turned the water into wine. Then we'll proceed to our hotel in Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee for dinner and overnight. (B/L/D)



October 19 - TIBERIAS - SEA OF GALILEE - CAPERNAUM - MOUNT OF BEATITUDES - PETER'S PRIMACY - MAGDALA

After breakfast we take a boat ride across the Sea of Galilee. While on the boat we'll pause for a brief worship service and remember the many miracles our Lord performed in this area. We'll dock at Nof Ginossar to visit the "Jesus Boat" museum to see a boat that dates back to the time of Jesus. Then we'll proceed to Capernaum to see the remains of an early church, the ruins of Peter's house, and the ancient synagogue. After lunch we'll travel to the Mount of Beatitudes



above the Sea of Galilee to read the Sermon on the Mount while overlooking the Jordan Valley. Next, we stop at the Primacy of Peter where Jesus commanded Peter to "Feed my sheep." Before returning to our hotel, we will visit the town of Magdala where recently a synagogue has been excavated from the time of Jesus. (B/L/D)

October 20 - BEIT SHE'AN - JERICHO - BETHABARA - JERUSALEM

This morning we will leave the Galilee area travel south through the Jordan River Valley. We will stop and visit the new excavations at Beit She'an, the city where the Philistines hung the bodies of Saul and Jonathan. After a brief worship service we'll travel through the Jordan Valley to Jericho, one of the oldest cities in the world. If conditions permit, we will enter Jericho to see the excavations of the ancient walls, view the Mount of Temptation, and see Elisha's Spring. Next we'll stop at Bethabara, where John baptized those who came to him (John 1:28). This is also known as the "place of crossing" and is near the area where the children of Israel crossed into the Promised Land (Joshua 3:14-17). We then travel to Jerusalem, the capital of Israel for over 3000 years, and pause on Mount Scopus where our guide will lead us in the traditional Jewish Welcome. Dinner and overnight will be at our hotel in Jerusalem. (B/L/D)

October 21 - MASADA - DEAD SEA - EIN GEDI - QUMRAN - VALLEY OF THE SHADOW OF DEATH

This morning we will get an early start and visit the mountain fortress of Masada, truly a remarkable piece of history. We'll ascend by cable car to visit the magnificent ruins of the fortress where the Jewish zealots made the

last stand of the Judean revolt against Rome. Today the remains of Herod's buildings, palaces, storehouses, cisterns, and a 6th Century Byzantine church are still in view. After our exciting tour of Masada we will continue to the Dead Sea, where you will have the opportunity to take a dip. The Dead Sea is 1300 feet below sea level and is the lowest spot on the earth. We will then stop at Ein Gedi, a green oasis in the middle of the desert, and see the area where David hid while fleeing from King Saul. Afterwards we will travel to Qumran to see the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. After lunch we will return to Jerusalem. On the way, we will stop to view the St. George Monastery, an active monastery since the 5th century. We will also get a glimpse of "the Valley of the Shadow of Death." (B/L/D)



This morning we will begin our tour with a visit to the Temple Mount where the Jewish temple stood until its destruction by the Roman Legions in 70 A.D. There we will see the Dome of the Rock Mosque built over the rock where Abraham prepared to sacrifice Isaac, the Al-Agsa Mosque, and the Golden Gate. We'll continue our walk through the Old City to the beautiful Crusader Church dedicated to St. Anne and the nearby Pool of Bethesda. Then we travel a short distance to the Mount of Olives for a breathtaking view of the city of Jerusalem. While we are here, our guide will point out all of the important sites of Jerusalem. After lunch, we will visit the Model City of Jerusalem as it was in 69 AD. If conditions permit, we will then take a short drive to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity, built over the cave of Christ's birth, as well as the Shepherd's Field and plains of Boaz. We will also see the ancient crafts of Bethlehem, dating from Crusader times, and visit one of the famous Bethlehem gift shops. (B/L/D)

October 23 - WESTERN WALL TUNNEL - PILATE'S PALACE - UPPER ROOM - JEWISH QUARTER - SOUTHERN WALL EXCAVATIONS - CITY OF DAVID

We begin with a visit to the famous Western Wall and Tunnel Excavation site. Here we will walk on the very stones where Jesus trod to Herod's "second temple" and see the place where our Savior taught the Scriptures. Then we will visit the Antonia Fortress, site of Pilate's Palace. We'll pass many of the traditional 14 Stations of the Cross on the Via Dolorosa and also



see part of the old colorful oriental market. We will continue our walk and visit the restored Jewish Quarter and the Roman Cardo, the main street of Jerusalem in Roman times. We will then proceed to Mount Zion to visit the Upper Room, traditional site of the Last Supper and the fire of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. We will be visiting the Southern

Wall excavation site. Here we will walk on the very stones where Jesus trod to Herod's "second temple" and see the place where our Savior taught the Scriptures. At the end of the day, we will see the City of David and Hezekiah's Tunnel and then return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. (B/L/D)

October 24 - GETHSEMANE - POOL OF SILOAM - HOUSE OF CAIAPHAS - LUTHERAN CHURCH OF THE RESURRECTION

Today is our last day in the Holy Land so we want to make the most of it. We will begin with a visit to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus had His agony and was betrayed. There we will pause for devotion and prayer time in a private garden. After our worship service, we will take a short walk through the Valley of the Tombs. Along the way we will pass the traditional tombs of Absalom and Ezra. After our walk we will visit the recent archaeological discovery of the Pool of Siloam. This is the place where Jesus told the blind man to wash the mud from his eyes so he would see. Then we will visit the House of Caiaphas where Peter denied Christ three times. After lunch, we will conclude our tour of the Holy Land with a visit to the Lutheran Church of the Resurrection, where we can remember Christ's crucifixion, burial, and resurrection and share in the Lord's Supper. After communion we will return to the hotel for dinner. (B/L/D)




