Christian Seder Meal - April 6

"Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change." James 1:17

The greatest gift given to us is the eternal life we have through Jesus by His death and resurrection. Before He sacrificed Himself for us, Jesus gave us a holy meal through which we receive His grace and forgiveness. Just as the Father graciously spared the Hebrews from death during the Passover, He not only spares us Christians but reconciles us to Him through the blood of the Holy Lamb – Jesus.

On Maundy Thursday, April 6 at 6:30 p.m., Trinity Downtown will celebrate a traditional Christian Seder meal with Holy Communion. This very special evening will also be the first time the First Communion Class participates in the Lord's Supper with our Trinity family.

Tickets are available through Palm Sunday (April 2). Please get your ticket early as seating is limited. Tickets to the Seder are free, but receiving your tickets will secure your seats for the evening.

A freewill offering will be gathered at the Seder for the dinner prepared by Treebeards. The menu includes Chicken Fried Chicken with Cream Gravy (a limited amount of Boneless Breast of Chicken with Fresh Basil Vinaigrette will also be available), Mashed Potatoes, Fresh Green Beans with Vinaigrette, French Bread and Butter and Butter Cake.

Childcare will be available for children 6 weeks - age 3. Please RSVP for childcare when you pick up your tickets. The children will be served chicken nuggets or you may bring their dinner.

Joseph - God Meant It For Good

One of the most well-known stories in the Old Testament is about Joseph. Movies and musicals have been made about his life. The climax of the story is when Joseph makes himself known to his eleven brothers 22 years after they had sold him off as a slave and told their father he was dead. In that moment, Joseph totally forgave these same brothers who had treated him so badly those many years before. Learning to forgive like that didn't happen overnight for Joseph. His life was shaped by God through difficult and challenging circumstances to make Joseph the man He had planned for



him to be. Joseph went from being a bratty little brother to the most powerful man in Egypt, second only to Pharaoh. He became a man of great faith and God used Joseph to save the lives of thousands of people. God had meant it all for good!

As you go through life and especially when you face difficult circumstances, have you ever considered that God might be shaping you to be the person He needs you to be to make a difference in the lives of others? Beginning on the Sunday after Easter, we'll be starting an eight-week sermon series looking at the life of Joseph. As we look at the key events in his story, it is hoped that this series will also be an encouragement to consider how God may be shaping you. Invite your friends and join Pastor Dorn in diving into the life of Joseph recorded in Genesis chapters 37 through 50.

Finance Corner - April 2023

The renovation of our Sanctuary continues on schedule, with our first worship service in the refreshed worship space scheduled for Palm Sunday! We'll be enjoying new flooring and pews, brighter lighting and a new audio system.

We will be magnifying the Lord together in the Sanctuary due to the combined generosity of our congregation; through February 28, 2023 our Magnify Capital Campaign recorded over \$735k in pledges, coming very close to our \$750k campaign goal, and received over \$418k in gifts.

If you haven't yet had an opportunity to make a pledge to the Magnify Capital Campaign, please prayerfully consider doing so. You may find a commitment card as you enter the Sanctuary, or you may record your Magnify pledge online here.

Tithes and offerings for the month of February were 4% lower than our monthly budget, but our expenses were also a bit lower than budgeted. So far in 2023, our tithes and offerings are 3% under budget, while our expenses have been just a bit lower than what we expected. Average worship attendance in February was 453, which is 51 worshipers more than the same period in 2022. In fact, attendance at February's Traditional service was higher than the number of participants in BOTH the Traditional and Contemporary worship services in February 2022!

A Stephen Ministry Story

A Steady Reminder of God's Presence

Mark and I had been married 26 years. Our sons were 18 and 20. We loved being parents, but with our younger son graduating high school, we were eagerly anticipating the empty nest and having more time for each other.

In the fall, when our younger son started college, Mark began having stomach issues and back pain, which would linger for a few days and then disappear, only to reappear later. He also developed a cough. When his doctor ordered an MRI, the results were devastating—Stage IV pancreatic cancer, already in his liver and both lungs. Mark was only 53.

Our lives were turned upside down. I suddenly found myself trying to provide emotional support to Mark and our sons during the worst experience any of us had ever endured. I wanted and needed to keep myself together to focus on caring for Mark, but I was emotionally drained—full of sadness and terrified of what the future held. I had always been a "take responsibility for everything myself" kind of person. However, I knew I couldn't do this alone.

I talked to my pastor about it, and she suggested matching me with a Stephen Minister. I agreed, and less than two weeks after Mark was diagnosed, my Stephen Minister came for the first of her weekly visits.

It's difficult to convey how important this Stephen Ministry relationship was for me. Our pastor was wonderful, and we had an amazing amount of support from many other people, but the time I spent with my Stephen Minister was the only time in the week when I could truly focus on my own needs. She was there just for me.

My Stephen Minister let me know that, while she was very concerned for Mark, her role was to be my support—to listen and help me process what I was feeling and going through, without giving advice or telling me what to do. The consistency of our Stephen Ministry relationship was crucial in helping me cope. Her weekly visits became an anchor in my life—something I could rely on when everything else was so uncertain. She was a steady reminder of God's presence, helping me know I was never alone.



Although Mark and I chose to talk publicly about his condition, my Stephen Ministry relationship was completely confidential. I knew I could share anything with her, and that's where it would stay.

Mark's illness progressed rapidly—ten weeks of treatment, followed by six weeks of hospice, and then his passing. My needs changed as I went from being a wife to being a caregiver to being a grieving widow and dealing with everything that the loss of a spouse entails. Through it all, my Stephen Minister's love and support continued. She was there for me at every stage of my journey. It was never easy, but my Stephen Minister helped me through the most difficult moments of my life.

I really can't say enough about how much I appreciate my church's Stephen Ministry. The compassionate, consistent, and confidential support of my Stephen Minister was so important in helping me cope—and then begin to heal.

Stephen Ministers provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people experiencing grief, divorce, major illness, Ioneliness, financial stress, and other life difficulties. 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
Magnify Prayer Request/Prayer Warriors

New Opportunities Abound at LEAH Downtown



volunteers to share her love for Jesus and music with the children. Even the youngest of our children enjoy listening to and playing music. Sing to the Lord a new song!



Upcoming Ladies Circle meeting dates are May 4th and June 1st.



Liturgical Arts





October 16 - DEPART USA

Today we meet at our international departure airport where our host will assist with check-in formalities. This evening we will enjoy a delicious dinner high above the Atlantic.

October 17 - ARRIVE TEL AVIV - JOPPA

We arrive in Tel Aviv this morning. Upon arrival, our TEMPLETON TOURS representative will meet us and assist us in gathering our luggage. After airport procedures are completed, we will meet our local guide and driver and begin our tour of the Holy Land. We

start with a visit to Joppa, Jonah's port of embarkation for Tarshish. Joppa was also the home of Tabitha (or Dorcas) who was raised from the dead by Peter. It was also here that Peter learned that God was interested in the salvation of the Gentiles. We then transfer to our hotel on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea for dinner and overnight. (D)

October 18 - TEL AVIV - CAESAREA - MOUNT CARMEL - MEGIDDO - NAZARETH -TIBERIAS

After breakfast at our hotel we will travel up the coast to Caesarea by the Sea. There we will visit the Crusaders' castle, the Roman theater, the seaport from which the Apostle Paul sailed to Rome, and the Roman aqueduct system. We will continue along the coast to Mount Carmel to see the site of Elijah's triumph over the prophets of Baal. After lunch we continue north to Megiddo on the Plain of Armageddon to see King

Solomon's stables and water supply system. Prophecy will come alive at Megiddo as we look over the Valley of Armageddon. We then travel to Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus, to visit. We will also visit The Precipice, where they wanted to throw Jesus off the "brow" and kill Him. On our way to Tiberias we will stop in the little town of Cana where Christ turned the water into wine. Then we'll proceed to our hotel in Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee for dinner and overnight. (B/L/D)



October 19 - TIBERIAS - SEA OF GALILEE - CAPERNAUM - MOUNT OF BEATITUDES - PETER'S PRIMACY - MAGDALA

After breakfast we take a boat ride across the Sea of Galilee. While on the boat we'll pause for a brief worship service and remember the many miracles our Lord performed in this area. We'll dock at Nof Ginossar to visit the "Jesus Boat" museum to see a boat that dates back to the time of Jesus. Then we'll proceed to Capernaum to see the remains of an early church, the ruins of Peter's house, and the ancient synagogue. After lunch we'll travel to the Mount of Beatitudes



above the Sea of Galilee to read the Sermon on the Mount while overlooking the Jordan Valley. Next, we stop at the Primacy of Peter where Jesus commanded Peter to "Feed my sheep." Before returning to our hotel, we will visit the town of Magdala where recently a synagogue has been excavated from the time of Jesus. (B/L/D)

October 20 - BEIT SHE'AN - JERICHO - BETHABARA - JERUSALEM

This morning we will leave the Galilee area travel south through the Jordan River Valley. We will stop and visit the new excavations at Beit She'an, the city where the Philistines hung the bodies of Saul and Jonathan. After a brief worship service we'll travel through the Jordan Valley to Jericho, one of the oldest cities in the world. If conditions permit, we will enter Jericho to see the excavations of the ancient walls, view the Mount of Temptation, and see Elisha's Spring. Next we'll stop at Bethabara, where John baptized those who came to him (John 1:28). This is also known as the "place of crossing" and is near the area where the children of Israel crossed into the Promised Land (Joshua 3:14-17). We then travel to Jerusalem, the capital of Israel for over 3000 years, and pause on Mount Scopus where our guide will lead us in the traditional Jewish Welcome. Dinner and overnight will be at our hotel in Jerusalem. (B/L/D)

October 21 - MASADA - DEAD SEA - EIN GEDI - QUMRAN - VALLEY OF THE SHADOW OF DEATH

This morning we will get an early start and visit the mountain fortress of Masada, truly a remarkable piece of history. We'll ascend by cable car to visit the magnificent ruins of the fortress where the Jewish zealots made the

last stand of the Judean revolt against Rome. Today the remains of Herod's buildings, palaces, storehouses, cisterns, and a 6th Century Byzantine church are still in view. After our exciting tour of Masada we will continue to the Dead Sea, where you will have the opportunity to take a dip. The Dead Sea is 1300 feet below sea level and is the lowest spot on the earth. We will then stop at Ein Gedi, a green oasis in the middle of the desert, and see the area where David hid while fleeing from King Saul. Afterwards we will travel to Qumran to see the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. After lunch we will return to Jerusalem. On the way, we will stop to view the St. George Monastery, an active monastery since the 5th century. We will also get a glimpse of "the Valley of the Shadow of Death." (B/L/D)



This morning we will begin our tour with a visit to the Temple Mount where the Jewish temple stood until its destruction by the Roman Legions in 70 A.D. There we will see the Dome of the Rock Mosque built over the rock where Abraham prepared to sacrifice Isaac, the Al-Agsa Mosque, and the Golden Gate. We'll continue our walk through the Old City to the beautiful Crusader Church dedicated to St. Anne and the nearby Pool of Bethesda. Then we travel a short distance to the Mount of Olives for a breathtaking view of the city of Jerusalem. While we are here, our guide will point out all of the important sites of Jerusalem. After lunch, we will visit the Model City of Jerusalem as it was in 69 AD. If conditions permit, we will then take a short drive to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity, built over the cave of Christ's birth, as well as the Shepherd's Field and plains of Boaz. We will also see the ancient crafts of Bethlehem, dating from Crusader times, and visit one of the famous Bethlehem gift shops. (B/L/D)

October 23 - WESTERN WALL TUNNEL - PILATE'S PALACE - UPPER ROOM - JEWISH QUARTER - SOUTHERN WALL EXCAVATIONS - CITY OF DAVID

We begin with a visit to the famous Western Wall and Tunnel Excavation site. Here we will walk on the very stones where Jesus trod to Herod's "second temple" and see the place where our Savior taught the Scriptures. Then we will visit the Antonia Fortress, site of Pilate's Palace. We'll pass many of the traditional 14 Stations of the Cross on the Via Dolorosa and also



see part of the old colorful oriental market. We will continue our walk and visit the restored Jewish Quarter and the Roman Cardo, the main street of Jerusalem in Roman times. We will then proceed to Mount Zion to visit the Upper Room, traditional site of the Last Supper and the fire of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. We will be visiting the Southern

Wall excavation site. Here we will walk on the very stones where Jesus trod to Herod's "second temple" and see the place where our Savior taught the Scriptures. At the end of the day, we will see the City of David and Hezekiah's Tunnel and then return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. (B/L/D)

October 24 - GETHSEMANE - POOL OF SILOAM - HOUSE OF CAIAPHAS - LUTHERAN CHURCH OF THE RESURRECTION

Today is our last day in the Holy Land so we want to make the most of it. We will begin with a visit to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus had His agony and was betrayed. There we will pause for devotion and prayer time in a private garden. After our worship service, we will take a short walk through the Valley of the Tombs. Along the way we will pass the traditional tombs of Absalom and Ezra. After our walk we will visit the recent archaeological discovery of the Pool of Siloam. This is the place where Jesus told the blind man to wash the mud from his eyes so he would see. Then we will visit the House of Caiaphas where Peter denied Christ three times. After lunch, we will conclude our tour of the Holy Land with a visit to the Lutheran Church of the Resurrection, where we can remember Christ's crucifixion, burial, and resurrection and share in the Lord's Supper. After communion we will return to the hotel for dinner. (B/L/D)

October 25 - ARRIVE USA

Today our memorable journey comes to an end. We will transfer to the airport in Tel Aviv and board the plane for our return flight home. In flight we can fellowship with our friends and remember the many things we shared together.
