Hymnal Marathon - August 12

Organist, Benjamin Kolodziej will play through all 635 hymns in the Lutheran Service Book live from Trinity Downtown on Saturday, August 12 starting at 9:00 a.m.

Playing on Trinity's 50-rank Holtkamp/Reuter organ, Kolodziej will play a creative introduction and one stanza of each hymn with this endeavor ending about 7:00 p.m. that evening. The church will be open for anyone to drop in and listen live or you may listen throughout the day as we live stream this marathon on Trinity's YouTube channel and on our website.

The hymnal, containing a treasury of the Church's songs, deserves to be explored and sung that its hymns might edify, comfort, encourage, and provide the Word of God to all, and this event serves to draw attention to our heritage of sacred song.

Benjamin Kolodziej is the organist/choirmaster at St. John's Episcopal Church in Dallas and is the organist for the Perkins Chapel at Southern Methodist University. Kolodziej recently published a book, Joyful Singing: A Story of Lutheran Sacred Music in Texas.




Giving Memorial and Honorarium Gifts Made Easier!

The following are some thoughts from Steve Bayless which were published in the Spring edition of the HLC Newsletter:

6 Ways to Experience More Peace Today

"A study showed that in 1968 it took 15 hours to record one hour of pure nature without the ambient sounds of airplanes, cars, and other manufactured reverberations. As of the year 2005, it took more than 2,000 hours of recorded time to yield the same hour of pure nature sounds."* Can you even imagine what it would take today?!

This striking quote spells out something we already know – finding silence requires intentionality. Stillness, quiet, and rest don't just happen; we have to make space for them, now more than ever.



Here are six practical ways to build more margin into your life and create room for greater peace:

- 1. **Set limits.** Overbooked schedules edge out time for rest. Create rules and structure around the time you spend looking at screens, fulfilling commitments, and even working.
- 2. **Declutter.** Excess stuff in your space brings excess clutter to your mind. Organize and simplify your home to enjoy greater rest.
- 3. Solve a problem that's been bothering you. It's easy to procrastinate solving issues that cause us stress but dealing with them brings relief.
- **4. Adjust your family rhythms.** What drains your energy, adds stress, or robs you of family time? What could you change to create more time with loved ones? Could you plan to travel, serve, play, or give together?
- **5. Practice the Sabbath.** The Jewish tradition of Sabbath means to denote a particular expanse of time as set apart for rest. Worship, contemplation, prayer, and simply taking a nice, long exhale can all help us pause and reconnect with God and ourselves.
- **6. Plan for the future.** Have you created an estate plan? Roughly 70% of Americans do not have an up-to-date will; many avoid the process because they feel overwhelmed or assume they have many years still to prepare. The process of creating or updating a will can be surprisingly simple, and it creates immeasurable peace of mind.

God's design is that we would work **from** our rest, not work until we collapse into it. Maybe that's why man's first day on earth was one to rest – God's sending us a message, loud and clear.

Finance Corner - July 2023

[Jesus said] give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you." Luke 6:38 ESV

I am happy to report that contributions to our Magnify Capital Campaign continue apace even in the summer months. **Total contributions through the end of May were \$609,500.** Praise to the Lord for His blessings!

If you haven't yet had an opportunity to make a pledge to the Magnify Capital Campaign, please prayerfully consider doing so. You may find a commitment card as you enter the Sanctuary, or you may record your Magnify pledge online https://example.com/here/.

Tithes and offerings for the month of May were 17% lower than our monthly budget, and expenses in May were just a bit lower than budgeted. So far in 2023, our tithes and offerings are 11% under budget, with YTD total revenues (which includes miscellaneous income) \$47,514 (or 7%) lower than planned. YTD expenses remained 1% lower than planned. Average worship attendance in May was 388, which is 35 more worshippers than the same period in 2022, when we offered both Traditional and Contemporary services. Compared with May of 2022, attendance at the Traditional service increased by 103 worshippers!

Magnify Campaign Update

- Thank you to all who have supported this renovation through your gifts, prayers, and encouragement. While we continue the fulfillment phase of the campaign, we also begin to focus on how we can use our renovated space to bring others into our Trinity community through both worship services and other community outreach events, including performances and concerts.
- Pledges through May 31, 2023 totaled \$756,000, exceeding our pledge goal. Praise the Lord for the generosity of this community. We are also pleased to report we have received gifts totaling \$609,500 which puts us at 81% of our goal. We are grateful to the Lord and our Trinity family for your generosity and response to this request.
- The Magnify campaign will continue through the end of 2023, but almost all of the costs associated with the Sanctuary refresh have already been incurred. We have been able to fund these up-front payments by "borrowing from ourselves" using Trinity's cash reserves.

In gratitude, the University will recognize Pastor Lonnie as a celebrated alumnus of Concordia University Texas Class of '95 who has used his gifts and calling as a pastor to lead and impact the lives of others with the Gospel specifically by serving the local church in the Greater Houston Area as a local pastor of beloved congregations such as Fishers of Men Lutheran Church from 2000-2005, Gloria Dei Lutheran Church from 2005-2018, City Director of LINC Houston from 2018-2022, US Army Military Chaplain from 2012-2020, and now

at Trinity Downtown. The Award will be presented to Pastor Lonnie on the evening of August 20, 2023 in Pearland, Texas.

In addition, Pastor Lonnie was appointed by the Board of Regents for Concordia University Texas to be one if it's newest members of the Board. He will begin his 4-year term of service to the University beginning August 2023.

From Pastor Lonnie, "This Award is a testimony of how God can make a way of service to God and others from an inner-city kid of Houston to a leader in his community. Trinity Downtown is a big part of my story that helped me mature and aspire for service. I am grateful for so many who have poured into my life, so this award is a testimony for all the people in my life who loved and strengthened me through their service in ministry. Pastor's Study - Scripture De Jour


