

advancing Christian education, by using in a special way the talents with which the Lord has endowed them.



Estate Gifts Enhance Worship Music

Recent estate gifts from a member and a former member of Trinity were designated toward enhancing our organ with some additional sounds. These additions consist of two 32' stops, 12 notes to complete our 16' Oboe, and a Harp stop. The 32' stops add a musical dimension to the organ that we did not have. They deepen and enrich the low frequencies of the organ - as only they can. One of the 32' stops, the Bourdon, is used under lighter registrations. The other is the 32' Trombone, a boisterous stop that is the crown jewel to the Pedal division of the organ. This stop is often added under more "full organ" settings. The Harp stop replicates a sound more like a marimba or xylophone, rather than the plucked harp. When heard, it often makes the listener smile.

In addition to the organ enhancement, two additional octaves of hand chimes were donated to fill out the depth of our handbell/handchime sounds.

We deeply appreciate the generosity of the donors for these musical additions. The families will be joining us as we dedicate the upgraded organ and expanded hand chimes during our worship service on September 17th.

While scheduling an appointment ahead of time gives us an estimate of how many donors to expect and the Blood Center sends out the appropriate number of workers; an added bonus is we take scheduled appointments prior to walk-ups.

We look forward to a very successful drive. Double red cell and combination whole blood and plasma machines will be available for those wishing to donate that way. Both count for two donations.

All successful donors will receive a pair of **"We Bleed Orange**" socks.

Save time with the DIGITAL DONOR APP. The App makes it easy to find a blood drive, schedule your donation and answer the CFL Express Pass health history interview before you arrive.

REMINDER!! The minimum donor age requirement to give blood is 16 years old with a parent's permission. Weight must be 122 lbs. (still 110 lbs. for 17 and older) and in general good health.

REMEMBER: one unit of blood can save as many as three lives as it is broken down into three components – red blood cells, platelets and plasma.

Finance Corner - September 2023

Make me to know Your ways, O Lord; teach me Your paths. Lead me in Your truth and teach me, for You are the God of my salvation; for You I wait all the day long. Psalm 25:4-5 ESV

Well, summer has come and gone. Vacations are beginning to seem like a distant memory (except for the resulting credit card bills), and the kids are back to school. College students are buckling down for the Fall semester, and it's time for all of us to re-engage with our "regular" activities.

Trinity Downtown's programs, activities and ministries didn't slow down a bit during the summer, with mission trips for our students and greater-than-expected worship participation. Our Fall kick-off event was a huge success, and we are so grateful for our Discipleship Hour teachers who faithfully provide the opportunity for us to learn God's Word and put it into practice.

Our Discipleship Hour classes averaged 147 participants in July, which is a bit higher than 2022 despite the fact that CASA, our Spanishlanguage partner, put their Discipleship Hour classes on hiatus for this summer. Perhaps most importantly, we celebrated two adult baptisms in July, bringing out total baptisms for the year to 14!

Gifts to our Magnify Capital Campaign totaled \$708k at the end of July, with pledges of \$755k exceeding our \$750k goal. Although they were below our budget, tithes and offerings through July were just slightly lower than this time last year. Our YTD operational expenses through July were 1% lower than our budget and were 5% higher than what was incurred during the same period last year.

This year we are developing teams around events. If you are interested in planning, executing, and developing different events, please let me know!



Back to School Excitement and Apprehension

As the calendar flips towards another school or college semester, a mixture of excitement and apprehension fills the air. The return to school naturally brings with it a unique set of stresses that can sometimes leave us feeling overwhelmed. However, viewing these challenges through a Christian perspective offers a comforting lens through which to navigate these milestones in our lives.

Fear often accompanies new beginnings, be it the fear of inadequacy, the pressure to perform, or the unknown terrain ahead. Christians are encouraged to overcome fear with unwavering trust in the loving hand of God.



Balancing the rigorous demands of school and extracurricular activities with spiritual devotion can be a struggle. Yet, from a Christian perspective, finding equilibrium is an essential lesson. Just as Christ balanced His ministry with times of solitude and prayer, we should be good role models showing our children how to allocate time for both intellectual growth and spiritual nourishment.

And, of course, the cornerstone of Christianity is grace – the unearned love and favor of God. In the whirlwind of back-to-school preparation and the stress of re-entering school, grace will help our students embrace imperfections and setbacks with self-compassion, and foster growth without the burden of self-condemnation.

By embracing trust over uncertainty, faith over fear, and unity over isolation, students can embark on their educational journeys with a renewed sense of purpose and inner peace.

Are you feeling sad or anxious, facing financial difficulties or grieving the loss of a loved one? God never intended for us to go through these challenges alone. You can reach out to Trinity's Stephen Ministry for assistance. Stephen Ministers are laypeople in our congregation trained to provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care to individuals facing difficult times in life—grief, cancer, divorce, financial difficulties, hospitalization, chronic illness, job loss, disability, loneliness, a spiritual crisis, or other life struggles. They have a compassionate heart for those who are hurting, and they have been equipped with caring ministry skills by their congregation's Stephen Leaders. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with that person once a week to listen, care, pray, encourage, and offer emotional and spiritual support.

Magnify Campaign Update

- The Magnify campaign is the first step in our plan to revitalize our facilities and, through these
 improvements, carry out the Lord's Great Commission to bring others into our Trinity community
 through both worship services and other community outreach events, including performances
 and concerts.
- The final pieces of the Sanctuary Refresh are nearing completion with the installation of replacement lighting in the Balcony awaiting the arrival of the last three fixtures.
- We are pleased to report that through July 31st, pledges to the Magnify campaign total \$755,000, exceeding our pledge goal. Gifts through July 31st total \$707,990, or 94% of the total funds pledged.
- Any capital campaign gifts above the original campaign goal of \$750,000 will be used to defray the Sanctuary Refresh construction costs that were incurred and paid for out of cash reserves.
- Thank you to all who have supported this renovation, through your gifts, prayers, and encouragement. The Magnify campaign will continue through the end of 2023, so if you have not yet contributed, we ask that you prayerfully consider how you might participate in this effort to bring the grace and love of Jesus to our community.


