Finance Corner - October 2023

...for God loves a cheerful giver. 2 Corinthians 9:7b ESV

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Downtown:

Events are running full-tilt at Trinity, with youth and children's events, a Symphony Orchestra concert, Oktoberfest and Trunks 'n' Treats all scheduled for this month. Unfortunately, I must report that tithes and offerings in August were 8% lower than our monthly budget, and our year-to-date budget deficit reached 12% (or \$131k). Giving so far in 2023 lags a bit behind what we received in 2022.

We've reacted to the giving shortfall; our operational expenses in August were 7% lower than our monthly budget, bringing Trinity's year-to-date expenses 2% below our spending plan.

So as we approach the last quarter of 2023, our regular giving remains about 4 weeks less than the spending plan approved by the congregation. Your gifts of time, treasure and prayer are an important way you can participate in sharing the love of Christ to our city, so please prayerfully consider how the Lord would have you respond to our financial shortage.

Gifts to our Magnify Capital Campaign totaled \$725k at the end of August, with pledges of \$757k exceeding our \$750k goal.

The Power of Empathy: Key to Building Meaningful Relationships

In a world filled with digital distractions and fast-paced living, the art of building meaningful relationships can sometimes feel like a lost skill. All of us are tempted to prioritize our own needs and objectives over the needs of our family, classmates, co-workers and neighbors. We sometimes lack empathy, a fundamental quality that serves as the cornerstone for forging deep and lasting relationships.

Our recent Stephen Ministry continuing education classes have focused on studying "The Gift of Empathy" by Joel Bretscher and Kenneth Haugk. Empathy, often described as the ability to understand and share the feelings of another, is a potent force that bridges the gap between individuals. It is the emotional glue that binds us together, fostering understanding, trust, and genuine connections.

Here's how empathy is the key to building relationships:

1. Creating a Safe Space: When we practice empathy, we create a safe and non-judgmental environment for others to express themselves. Knowing that someone genuinely cares about our thoughts and feelings

encourages us to open up, leading to more meaningful conversations.



- 2. Strengthening Trust: Trust is the bedrock of any relationship. When you demonstrate empathy, you show that you value the other person's perspective and emotions. This, in turn, builds trust as people feel more secure in your presence and are more likely to reciprocate by trusting you.
- **3. Enhanced Communication:** Empathetic individuals are better listeners. They pay attention to verbal and non-verbal cues, allowing them to grasp not just what is being said, but also what is left unspoken. This heightened awareness leads to more effective and meaningful communication.
- **4. Conflict Resolution:** Empathy plays a pivotal role in resolving conflicts. When you can see a situation from someone else's point of view, it becomes easier to find common ground and reach compromises. Instead of escalating disputes, empathy helps de-escalate them.
- **5. Building Emotional Bonds:** Empathy connects people on an emotional level. By truly understanding another person's emotions, you can forge deeper bonds that go beyond superficial interactions. This emotional connection is the foundation of strong relationships.
- **6. Empowering Others:** When you empathize with someone, you empower them to be their authentic selves. Knowing that their feelings are acknowledged and respected boosts their self-esteem and strengthens the relationship.
- **7. Nurturing Compassion:** Practicing empathy isn't just about understanding others—it also cultivates compassion within us. This compassionate outlook extends to all aspects of our lives and can have a ripple effect, creating a more empathetic society.

- **8. Longevity and Resilience:** Empathetic relationships tend to endure the test of time. They are resilient in the face of challenges because they are built on a foundation of understanding and support.
- **9. Personal Growth:** Empathy is a two-way street. As you empathize with others, you also grow as an individual. It broadens your perspective, enhances your emotional intelligence, and makes you a better friend, partner, and communicator.
- **10. Empathy as a Universal Language:** Empathy transcends cultural, linguistic, and geographical boundaries. It is a universal language that enables connections with people from all walks of life.

In a world where we are often encouraged to focus on ourselves, Jesus showed us how loving empathy is crucial to building relationships.

Stephen Ministers are commissioned members of our congregation who have received specialized training to equip them to provide Christ-focused, empathetic, highly confidential care and prayer support to people experiencing a crisis, facing a challenge or simply going through a tough time.

Magnify Campaign Update

- The Magnify campaign is the first step in our plan to revitalize our facilities and, through these improvements, carry out the Lord's Great Commission to bring others into our Trinity community, both through worship services and other community outreach events, such as performances and concerts.
- The final steps of the Sanctuary Refresh are nearing completion with the installation of the last three fixtures in the Balcony.
- We are pleased to report that through August 31st, pleages to the Magnify campaign total \$757,400, which exceeds our

goal. Actual payments received total \$725,097, which is 96% of the total funds pledged.

Lutheran World Relief

Lutheran World Relief (LWR) is an organization which works with Lutherans and other partner organizations around the world to end poverty, injustice and human suffering. LWR was created in 1945 to provide relief to Europe after World War II and has continued providing help and support to over 37.3 million people in 40 countries including Lebanon, Ukraine, Chile, and South Sudan. When disaster strikes, LWR provides life-saving relief and support to those most in need and continues long after the headlines have faded, working with communities to rebuild their lives and recover their livelihoods. LWR, along with local partners, helps people to have access to clean water and health care, teaches people about water management, diseases of poverty, and agricultural techniques, and provides people with the skills to participate in the decision making processes that affect their lives. Small-scale farmers have access to markets through LWR such as Fair Trade Coffee and Fair Trade Chocolate. LWR is part of the Lutheran Malaria Initiative to eliminate deaths from malaria in Africa. To learn more about LWR, go to www.lwr.org. The Ladies Circle Ministries members support LWR by assembling the kits of care. The Houston area gathering of the quilts and kits to be sent to LWR will be on Saturday, November 4th.

The Ladies Circle Ministries members want to encourage our Trinity family to make the kits of care. A kit is a simple expression of comfort to those suffering, of love to those in need, and of dignity and hope in the direst situations. Please bring your kits to church by Sunday, October 29th and put them in the LWR container in the church office.

PERSONAL CARE KITS

- 1 bath-size towel (approximately 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- 2 bath-size bars (4 to 5 ounces each) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*
- 1 sturdy comb, remove packaging
- 1 metal nail clippers, remove packaging

*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing the individual toothbrush in a business envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new or in good condition. Wrap all items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarns. Do not use any plastic bags.

SCHOOL KITS

- 470-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 101/2"; no looseleaf paper
- 1 30-cm ruler or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other side; pack in a notebook
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- 5 black/blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band



- 1 box 16 or 24 crayons
- 1 2½" eraser
- 1 sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)


Do not add other items or leave out any item listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Remove excess packaging; pack all items in bag and close. Do not enclose the kit or any of its items in plastic bags.

BABY CARE KITS

- 2 light weight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies®)
- 2 long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- 2 receiving blankets, medium weight cotton or flannel or crocheted or knitted with light weight yarn, up to 52" square
- 4 cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- 1 jacket, sweater, or sweatshirt with hood, or include a baby cap
- 2 pairs of socks
- 1 hand towel, dark color recommended
- 2 bath-size bars (4 to 5 ounces each) of gentle soap, in original wrapping
- 2 diaper pins or large safety pins

Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Varying sizes of the clothing items will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows. Sweaters with buttons or tie down the front are preferred. Diapers can be made from flannel. Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) may be substituted for new ones. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins. Do not enclose the kit or any of its items in plastic bags.

Donated items should not have any religious symbols, messages or Trinity's name or be decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.



Stephen Buzard is one of the leading organists of his generation, serving as Director of Music at historic St. James Cathedral in downtown Chicago. His playing is both thoughtful and heartfelt, dazzling audiences with his technique and engaging programming.

Stephen Buzard grew up in a household filled with organ music. His father is the president and founder of Buzard Pipe Organ Builders, and his mother is an Episcopal organist and choirmaster. Buzard attended Westminster Choir College where he studied organ performance with virtuoso Ken Cowan. During this time, Buzard recorded his first solo album "In light or darkness" and won the prestigious Arthur Poister Competition.

After graduation, Buzard became senior organ scholar at Wells Cathedral in the UK where he accompanied for daily choral services and assisted in the training of the boy and girl choristers. He returned to the United States to study with Thomas Murray at the Yale Institute of Sacred Music.

In 2013, Buzard became Assistant Organist at Saint Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue in New York City. Following the tragic death of Director of Music John Scott, Buzard became Acting Organist and Director of Music, leading the church's world-renowned choir of men and boys.

In 2016, Buzard was called to St. James Cathedral in Chicago, following in the footsteps of Dudley Buck, Clarence Dickinson, and Leo Sowerby. In addition to maintaining the church's excellent musical heritage, he founded a chorister program for boys and girls and an organ scholarship to train the next generation of church musicians. His career was highlighted in the AGO monograph series "The Making of an Organ Virtuoso."
