Stephen Buzard

Stephen Buzard is one of the leading organists of his generation, serving as Director of Music at historic St. James Cathedral in downtown Chicago. His playing is both thoughtful and heartfelt, dazzling audiences with his technique and engaging programming.

Stephen Buzard grew up in a household filled with organ music. His father is the president and founder of Buzard Pipe Organ Builders, and his mother is an Episcopal organist and choirmaster. Buzard attended Westminster Choir College where he studied organ performance with virtuoso Ken Cowan. During this time, Buzard recorded his first solo album "In light or darkness" and won the prestigious Arthur Poister Competition.

After graduation, Buzard became senior organ scholar at Wells Cathedral in the UK where he accompanied for daily choral services and assisted in the training of the boy and girl choristers. He returned to the United States to study with Thomas Murray at the Yale Institute of Sacred Music.

In 2013, Buzard became Assistant Organist at Saint Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue in New York City. Following the tragic death of Director of Music John Scott, Buzard became Acting Organist and Director of Music, leading the church's world-renowned choir of men and boys.

In 2016, Buzard was called to St. James Cathedral in Chicago, following in the footsteps of Dudley Buck, Clarence Dickinson, and Leo Sowerby. In addition to maintaining the church's excellent musical heritage, he founded a chorister program for boys and girls and an organ scholarship to train the next generation of church musicians. His career was highlighted in the AGO monograph series "The Making of an Organ Virtuoso."

Finance Corner - November 2023

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Downtown:

The Fall season is upon us, and the activities at Trinity Downtown are in full gear. We've already had two Fall Concert Series events, plus Oktoberfest and Trunks 'n' Treats. Average attendance during the first nine months of 2023 increased compared with the same time period in 2022, even though we suspended the Contemporary service early in 2023. The percentage of online participants has increased by 8% compared with 2022, and we've been honored to add 30 new members to our congregation so far in 2023! Compared to 2022, our (already stellar) participation in Discipleship Hour classes has increased, with an additional class now being offered by Pastor Lonnie. We've been especially blessed to have celebrated 14 baptisms so far this year, including 3 adults.

Gifts to our Magnify Capital Campaign totaled \$729k at the end of September, so we are within striking distance of making our \$750k goal by the end of 2023.

Thanks be to God for His bountiful blessings!

Home Treasury Giving Under Budget

Unfortunately, giving to the general needs of the church is a different story; through the end of September, tithes and offerings were 13% (or roughly \$162,000) lower than our annual budget. Giving so far in 2023 has been \$33,000 less than 2022's offerings.

Our YTD operational expenses through September were 2% (or \$32,000) lower than our budget and were 5% higher than what was incurred during the same period last year.

Please prayerfully consider how the Lord would have you respond to our financial shortage during this season of Thanksgiving. Your gifts of time, treasure and prayer are an important way you can participate in sharing the love of Christ to our city, and to keep our ministries operating at full speed.



Pastor Dorn will be leading his annual Christmas Video Bible Study beginning on December 3rd. *The Polar Express* is the movie the group will be watching.

The Polar Express is about an unnamed boy who has reached an age when he questions whether Santa Claus is real. He has found much evidence to disprove Santa's existence, including a World Book encyclopedia that says that the North Pole is "devoid of life." But



on Christmas Eve the boy is picked up by The Polar Express, a magical train that takes select children to the North Pole. The train takes the boy and his new friends on an icy roller coaster ride that, on multiple occasions, nearly ends in disaster.

The Polar Express is a story of faith. The film contains no religious imagery, quotes no Scriptures, and never mentions God, yet *The Polar Express* is a movie that touches the spirit with lessons about belief and friendship. It will undoubtedly prompt discussion on difficult spiritual questions such as, "What does it mean to believe—to truly believe?"

Magnify Campaign Update

- The Magnify campaign is the first step in our plan to revitalize our facilities and, through these improvements, carry out the Lord's Great Commission to bring others into our Trinity community, both through worship services and other community outreach events, such as performances and concerts.
- The final steps of the Sanctuary Refresh were completed in October with the installation of the last three lighting fixtures in the Balcony



- We are pleased to report that through September 30th, **pledges** to the Magnify campaign total \$758,875, which exceeds our goal. Actual payments received total \$729,007, which is 96% of the total funds pledged.
- Any capital campaign donations above the original campaign goal of \$750,000 will be used to offset the construction costs that were paid for out of the church's cash reserves.
- Thank you to all who have supported this renovation, through your gifts, prayers, and
 encouragement. The Magnify campaign will continue through the end of 2023, so if you have not
 yet contributed, please prayerfully consider how you might participate in this effort to bring the
 grace and love of Jesus to our community.

New "Vending Machine" Now Available!

For several years, Trinity has had vending machines located near the Gym entrance offering a variety of Dr. Pepper beverages. These machines were provided free of charge from the vendor, but all of the proceeds went to them. Given the relatively low volume of sales, our vendor decided to remove the machines early in October.

In response, we've replaced the vending machines with a large glass cooler filled with a variety of beverages from different bottling companies including coffee and tea products. We operate on the honor system: you can select whatever beverage suits your fancy, and pay online by scanning one of the QR codes that are attached to the cooler.

The really good news is that the prices have dropped; any canned drink can be purchased for a donation of \$1, while any bottled beverage costs \$1.50. Bottled water is available for \$.50. We'll be adding a cash option soon that will allow you to drop your donation into a small safe.

We'll also be adding healthy snacks to the honor system on a table next to the cooler.

And, we'd appreciate any thoughts on any additions to the beverage and snack selection, since it is now in Trinity's control!

Liturgical Arts


Led by Thomas DeVries and Anthony Flaviani - 10:15-11:15 AM - Room 206 - In Person
