

Annual Christmas Video Bible Study

Pastor Dorn will be leading his annual Christmas Video Bible Study beginning on December 3rd. *The Polar Express* is the movie the group will be watching.

The Polar Express is about an unnamed boy who has reached an age when he questions whether Santa Claus is real. He has found much evidence to disprove Santa's existence, including a World Book encyclopedia that says that the North Pole is "devoid of life." But



on Christmas Eve the boy is picked up by The Polar Express, a magical train that takes select children to the North Pole. The train takes the boy and his new friends on an icy roller coaster ride that, on multiple occasions, nearly ends in disaster.

The Polar Express is a story of faith. The film contains no religious imagery, quotes no Scriptures, and never mentions God, yet The Polar Express is a movie that touches the spirit with lessons about belief and friendship. It will undoubtedly prompt discussion on difficult spiritual questions such as, "What does it mean to believe—to truly believe?"

The movie is rated G and the study is open to all ages. Fresh popped popcorn will be served! The study will be held in Room 123 (Pastor Dorn's Office) at 10:15 a.m.

- Briskets are \$20 per lb. and will be shrink wrapped and frozen. They take 2 days to thaw before reheating. Briskets weigh 5-7 lbs. for a whole and 3-4 lbs, for a half,
- Pulled pork is \$15 per lb. and will be shrink wrapped and frozen in packages of 2, 4 and 6 lbs.
- Sausage links will be shrink wrapped and frozen in

packages of 2 for \$10, 4 for \$20, and 6 for \$25. The meat will be ready for pickup on Sunday morning, December 10th. Deadline to order is December 1st. Dear Members and Friends of Trinity Downtown:

Your generosity to the Magnify Capital Campaign officially ends at the end of 2023. As of October 31st, we've received *pledges* of \$760,273 (which exceeds our original \$750,000 goal!) We've received *gifts* of \$741,347 (again, through October 31st), and greatly appreciate those that have met (or exceeded) their pledge. If you've not yet fulfilled your pledge, please remember that the Campaign officially ends on December 31st. As a reminder, any funds received that exceed our \$750,000 goal will go toward replenishing the cash reserves that were used to fund a significant portion of the Sanctuary Refresh. Thank you so much for your generosity!

Home Treasury Remains Under Budget

Unfortunately, giving to the general needs of the church remains under budget. Through the end of October, tithes and offerings were 12% (or roughly \$179,000) lower than our annual budget. Giving so far in 2023 has been \$46,000 less than 2022's offerings during the same period.

Please prayerfully consider how the Lord would have you respond to our financial shortage during the last month of 2023. Your gifts of time, treasure and prayer are an important way you can participate in sharing the love of Christ to our city, and to keep our ministries operating at full speed.

Please remember we do not have a meeting in January. We will meet again in February.









Magnify Campaign Update

- The Magnify campaign officially ends on December 31st.
- The campaign is the first step in our plan to revitalize our facilities and through these improvements carry out the Lord's Great Commission to bring others into our Trinity community, both through worship services and other community outreach events, such as performances and concerts.
- We are pleased to report that through October 31st, pledges to the Magnify campaign total \$760,273, which exceeds our goal. Actual gifts received total \$741,347, which is 98% of the total funds pledged.



- Any capital campaign donations above the original campaign goal of \$750,000 will be used to offset the construction costs that were paid for out of the church's cash reserves.
- Thank you to all who have supported this renovation, through your gifts, prayers, and encouragement. Since the Magnify campaign concludes at the end of 2023, please make every effort to fulfill your pledge. If you have not yet contributed, please prayerfully consider how you might participate in this effort to bring the grace and love of Jesus to our community.

Blood Donor Sunday

Our next Blood Donor Sunday will be held January 14, 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in the gym. If you would prefer a special time, please sign up online at <u>https://www. commitforlife.org/donor/schedules/drive schedule/</u>. While scheduling an appointment ahead of time gives us an estimate of how many donors to expect and the Blood Center sends out the appropriate number of workers; an added bonus is we take scheduled appointments prior to walk-ups.

We look forward to a very successful drive. Double red cell and combination whole blood and plasma machines will be available for those wishing to donate that way. Both count for two donations.

Save time with the DIGITAL DONOR APP. The App makes it easy to find a blood drive, schedule your donation and answer the CFL Express Pass health history interview before you arrive.

REMINDER!! The minimum donor age requirement to give blood is 16 years old with a parent's permission. Weight must be 122 lbs. (still 110 lbs. for 17 and older) and in general good health.

REMEMBER: one unit of blood can save as many as three lives as it is broken down into three components – red blood cells, platelets and plasma.


